Students have completed the Food Hamper project, as some of you may have read in the *leaflets* a couple of weeks ago, and the results were quite astonishing. We are grateful that we can be a "hand and foot" to those in need. Thank you, Ms Vanderhorst and Grade 7 students, for your dedication and enthusiasm.

The annual Public Speaking Contest was held on Friday, May 1 at the WOCS. Each school was represented by its respective 3 finalists. At CCES we determined these finalists by means of a local contest on Wednesday, April 29. On that date 6 speakers (three from each grade) "faced off", so to speak, for the finalists positions. One of our finalists, Devon Stam, placed first, enabling us to take the plaque back to CCES.

A sign that the end of the school year is near is the annual Grade 8 Day. This year it was on Friday, May 15. (It's usually scheduled for the Friday preceding Victoria Day.) On that day the grade 7 students were expected to be at the high school for an orientation to high school schedules and procedures. We're sure that was an informative and exciting day for them. Some time around the same time the grade 7 students were also visited by the teacher in charge of High School Student Counseling (Mrs. S. Vandergugten) who explained to them the course selections to be made for their first year in High School.

The Ascension Day/Pentecost Assembly is scheduled for Monday, May

25 at 8:45 a.m. in the gym. These events may not mean much to the world, but to the church all over the world they are commemorated and celebrated as significant events in the life of the Church. Without His ascension Christ would not be seated at God's right hand to be our advocate and to gather, defend, and preserve His Church. Without Pentecost we would not have the Holy Spirit to lead holy-spirited lives and to proclaim the gospel to all people and nations. Pray that the Holy Spirit may continue to work mightily in us so that we may boldly and courageously do God's work here on earth.

From the school calendar you will note that Friday, May 29 is scheduled to be our Sports Day. This is an all-day event with many leisure as well as competitive activities. Such a day is also spiced up by goodies provided by the Credo Aid. Should the weather be of such nature that it would not be suitable for these kinds of events we will inform you via a message on the web site: www.credoces.org either the night before or very early the morning of May 29. In that case, the alternate date planned is Wednesday, June 3.

There are more sporting events on tab for the month of June (see also the school calendar update below):

- For many years our grade 7 students have been participants in the Christian Schools Softball Tournaments. About eight (maybe 10) teams are scheduled to spend Thursday, June 4 at the baseball diamonds of a Cloverdale Athletic Park. Each school team is requested

to supply one umpire. Those men or women who are willing to be one of our umpires are asked to let Sharon Allison or me know as soon as possible.

- Grade 6&7 students are also scheduled to participate in the annual quad-school Track and Field Day (Monday, June 8) at the Rotary Stadium in Abbotsford (corner of Threthewey and McClure). More details will follow.
- Softball round-robin with teams comprised of WOCS grade 6 & 7 students and CCES gr. 6 students, on Tuesday, June 16. More details to come.

And then, during the last week of school, the grade 7 students will be on their much anticipated Victoria Trip (June 15-18) along with their teacher Ms Rachel Vanderhorst and several parent chaperones. After all the fundraising activities (such as, hot dog sales and chocolate bars sales) they have managed to collect enough money to pay for the trip, camping fees, and main

attractions fees. While they will encamp at Goldstream Provincial Park, the main attractions will be in the city of Victoria: the Parliament buildings, the BC Royal Museum, etc. We pray that they will have an enjoyable time and that they may return safely on Thursday, June 18, just in time for the last day of the school year.

As just mentioned, the last day of the school year is Friday, June 19. Yes, that sounds like an early end, but we also had an early start (Sept. 2). That promises to be an exciting and hectic day here. It will be a day of clean-up and report cards and, finally, the Closing Assembly. We have scheduled this assembly to start at 2:00 p.m., in the school gym. As in other years, it will feature the primary grades bidding us adieu on behalf of the school community. That evening will feature the graduation of the grade 7 students from the elementary level of formal education. We hope you can make it to this event. It is a time to reflect upon and to praise God's covenantal faithfulness to us and to the children He has entrusted to us.

Short Report of Board Meeting

Short Report of the Board of Directors
of Credo Christian Elementary School
April 14, 2008

Opening: The chairman M. Stam opened with reading Philippians 2: 1-18 and prayer. Everyone was welcomed to the meeting.

Approval of Minutes and Short Report: Motion: "to approve the minutes of the March 10, 2009 meeting with minor corrections was made. Minutes and Short Report were approved.

Principal's report: The Principal's report as received prior to the meeting was discussed. Miss Jessica Dokter has been hired for the grade three teaching position. Mr. P. Torenvliet will be talking about curriculum at the next Combined Boards meeting scheduled for April 29, 2009. A letter was received from the Township of Langley denying our request to lower the speed limit in front of the school. FISA (Federation of Independent Schools Association) has urged all independent schools to participate in the electioneering process. They recommend appointing a person to take up contact with other Independent schools in the same riding and arrange a meeting with the candidates running for office in that riding. H. Moes is taking care of this. J. Roukema highlighted letters from the B.C parties on their stance for Independent Schools. At this time there appears to be no party interested in changing Independent school funding.

Finance Committee: The minutes of the April 7, 2009 meeting as received prior to the meeting were discussed. Motion: "to accept the 2009/10 CCES budget for presentation to the membership at the AGM" was made, seconded and carried.

Education Committee: The minutes of the March 31, 2009 meeting as received prior to the meeting were discussed. The EdCom has prepared a School Satisfaction Survey. The survey will be ready for the board to review by the May board meeting.

Maintenance Committee: The minutes of the April 6, 2009 meeting as received prior to the meeting were discussed. Motion: "to accept the Maintenance

Committee budget with a provision for re-waxing the gym floor" was made, seconded and approved.

Transportation rep report: The minutes of the March 2, 2009 meeting as received prior to the meeting were discussed. They are beginning to follow the SCSBC (Society of Christian Schools of British Columbia) recommendations. They have advertised for a business manager to assist D. Champ.

Development Committee: The minutes of the April 6, 2009 meeting as received prior to the meeting were discussed. Golf tournament responsibilities were handed out. They are working on a promotional pamphlet to be handed out to the membership.

CCHS report: The High School is very blessed with the staff arrangements made to provide a comprehensive teaching environment for Special Education and Learning Assistance. The CCHS budget was reviewed. The budget will be discussed further at the Combined Board's meeting.

Chairman's Report: Report on Ad-hoc Principal Search Committee meeting of April 8, 2009: A full information package should be completed soon. Report on Principal/Chairman's meeting of April 6, 2009: M. Stam reported that these meetings are an excellent way of expressing mutual thoughts and concerns between the schools.

Other Committee Reports (RCDC/CB's/CCP/RPDC/FISA/CCRTC): RCDC (Reformed Curriculum Development Committee) meeting held March 5, 2009: The minutes of the March 5, 2009 meeting as received prior to the meeting were discussed. The press release for the meeting was also reviewed.

Minutes of the CCES Membership Meeting
Wednesday, October 29, 2008 8:00 P.M.

1. Opening: The Chairman P.J. Schouten opened the meeting with singing Psalm 16: 1,2,3. He read from Psalm 16 and led us in prayer. Everyone was welcomed to the meeting. Quorum was present.
2. Approval of Minutes of the May 28th, 2008 meeting: Motion: "to approve the Minutes of the May 28, 2008 meeting as presented" was made, seconded and carried.
3. Business arising from the minutes: Report on Kindergarten. P.J. Schouten informed the membership that Principal J. Roukema has assured the board that the Kindergarten class is functioning well with the Teacher Assistant at this time and will continue to be monitored.
4. Secretary's Annual Report: Paul Sikma presented the annual report on board and committee activities of the 2007/08 school year to the membership.
5. Election of Board Members: There were no additional nominations to the names published in the last issue of "Branches". The nominations were Tim Bontkes, Richard Bredenhof, Mike Homan, Janet Schouten, Valerie Sikkema, Tako Slump, Kevin Van Delden, Sprout VanderGugten and Will VanOene. The ballots cast were counted and it was announced that three nominees had enough votes to be elected. A second ballot was cast for the fourth board member. Elected to the board are Tim Bontkes, Richard Bredenhof, Janet Schouten and Valerie Sikkema. All those individuals who let their name stand, were thanked.
6. Presentation of the Financial Statements for 2007/08: V. Stel presented the 2007/08 financial statements to the membership. Motion: "to accept the 2007/08 financial statements as presented" was made, seconded and approved.
7. FISA representative report: H. Moes spoke some words on behalf of FISA (Federation of Independent Schools). He highlighted that one of the things the Ministry of Education is proposing is full-time Kindergarten and half-time pre-school. FISA is in discussions with the Ministry of Education regarding this. They've made recommendations to the MOE that early learning decisions should be left up to parents and not be made mandatory. However, if the MOE decides to carry on with this proposal FISA has also recommended not to make learning or attendance mandatory and also that funding should be equal for both public and private schools. Questions. What kinds of schools/groups are in FISA? There are five major groups. 1) Association of Christian Schools International. 2) Society of Christian Schools. 3) Catholic schools. 4) Independent Schools Association. 5) Associate member group.
8. Question Period: Not made use of.
9. Closing: P.J. Schouten expressed appreciation for all his years as a board member of CCES. He thanked all the board members he served with in the past and wished them and the newly elected board members strength in their tasks. Motion: "to destroy the ballots" was made, seconded and approved. Reverend W. Bredenhof closed the meeting in prayer. Meeting was adjourned.

Budget Notes

- (1) Government grant** Actual grant value for 2008/09 used due to warning from Ministry that Independent Schools should not expect anything more for 2009/10.
- (2) Fees** Increased by \$5 for kindergarden and \$15 for Elementary and for Highschool to cover increased operating costs.
- (3) Salaries** The increase in salaries reflects the acceptance of the salary committee recommendation to increase salaries by 2.5%. At this point in time it also reflects an increase for the kindergarden teacher from 50% to full time.
- (4) Conventions** Increase due to attendance at principal conventions in Ontario and the Netherlands
- (5) Highschool Transfer Payments** Decrease due to an increase in enrolment for JCS which in turn reduces CCES's share in Highschool costs.
- (6) Building Maintenance-** Increase due to complete renovation of student bathrooms.
- (7) Busing** Increase due to the increase in enrollment and CCSTA fees for next year.

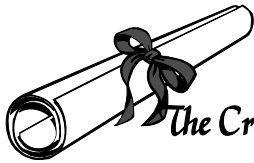

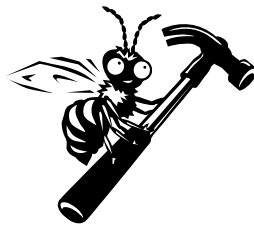
