

Credo Christian High School Health and Safety Measures for Students and Staff

In June 2020, staff and students had to take special precautions when returning to school. This gave us a glimpse at what a full return to school in September might be like. We, as staff, felt very blessed that over 90% of our students returned for the two weeks in June – a sign of the good cooperation that we experience between home and school.

Fast forward to the middle of August 2020. We implemented practices like hand washing, signage and the limited wearing of masks. Thankfully, the size of our school meant that almost all classes were able to proceed as normal.

After a revision in February 2021, we have been served with a further revision to the health and safety guidelines in March. Thankfully, our case count remains low. However, we wish to continue to act responsibly to reduce risk.

Our planned health and safety measures include:

1. Public Health Measures
 - a. CCHS will abide by all public health measures. Specifically, we will cooperate with Fraser Health and the Ministry of Education in any communication to the school community that concerns public health (such as a confirmed case of Covid-19 at the school).
 - b. All students and staff who have travelled outside of Canada must self-quarantine for 14 days upon return.
2. Environmental Measures
 - a. A full cleaning of the school building will take place once per school day.
 - b. High-touch surfaces will receive an additional cleaning in the middle of the school day, including PE materials where appropriate.
 - c. Teachers and/or students will sanitize desks at the beginning of each class in which a new cohort will be entering the room.
3. Administrative Measures
 - a. The provincial high school cohort limit is 120 people. Students at CCHS will be divided into four cohorts, as follows:
 - i. Grade 8: 54 students and 10 staff members
 - ii. Grade 9&10: 109 students and 10 staff members
 - iii. Grade 11: 60 students and 5 staff members
 - iv. Grade 12: 64 students and 6 staff members
 - b. Most classes will be composed of a single cohort. When classes include multiple cohorts, or if the teacher is outside the cohort, physical distancing will be in effect. To assist in contact tracing, consistent seating plans will be the norm in classrooms.
 - c. Special procedures will be implemented for physical education and music classes, in accordance with provincial requirements.

- d. Homerooms will be organized within cohort (mostly by grade).
 - e. At the beginning of the day, students and staff will be required to do a health check. Individuals with symptoms will not be permitted to attend. The student health check should be completed by parents, who have agreed in writing that they will do so.
 - f. At the end of the day, dismissal times and exits will be staggered to minimize contact between cohorts as students leave the school and enter the busses.
 - g. Whole-school gatherings such as assemblies will not take place. However, students can gather in large groups with appropriate spacing between cohorts.
 - h. Only one student or visitor will be allowed at the office desk at a time.
 - i. Visitors who need to proceed past the office will sign in and out and wear a visitor pass or tag, as well as a mask.
4. Personal Measures
- a. Students and staff must **stay home when they are sick**. It is expected that students or staff with Covid-like symptoms will consult a health professional (e.g. phone 811) and follow their advice, including obtaining a Covid-19 test if necessary. If a positive result is obtained, staff members and students are expected to inform the school.
 - b. Students or staff may return to school after symptoms disappear or on the advice of a health professional.
 - c. Students will sanitize their hands upon entering the school. Sanitizer will be available in each classroom and in the office.
 - d. Students and staff should cough or sneeze into their sleeve; refrain from touching their eyes, nose or mouth with unwashed hands; and refrain from sharing food and drink.
5. Personal protective equipment
- a. Masks will be provided for all students and staff. Additional masks can be purchased.
 - b. A student or staff member may choose to wear a mask and/or face shield at any time during the school day.
 - c. Students and staff are required to wear masks in all indoor areas, except while eating/drinking or using a barrier. Due to the presence of hearing impaired students in the school, staff may remove their masks in the classroom if they can maintain distance with students.
 - d. Any student who is prevented from wearing a mask for medical and/or behavioural reasons will be exempted from the requirement to do so. Such an exemption will require a written note from a parent. The note will be kept on file.
 - e. Parents who wish to exempt students from the requirement to wear a mask at their desks may also do so by informing the school office.

While our trust is ultimately in God (Ps 46: 1-3) we must continue to act responsibly to protect ourselves and our neighbor, including our fellow staff members and students. As such, we thank you for your cooperation.
